

Would you like to train to become a Primary teacher? From September 2019, you can do this with us, in conjunction with the University of Birmingham

From October 9th 2018, you can apply via UCAS for a place on the year-long School Direct Primary teacher training programme, led by Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance.

Placements will be in three of the schools within the Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance, and 26 days of the academic year will be spent at the University of Birmingham.

Is this the course for you?

We are looking for candidates with motivation, enthusiasm and a clear rationale for teaching. It is important that students are committed to teaching as a long-term career, and also hold the relevant academic profile and intellectual capacity. We would like candidates to have a strong subject knowledge, relevant school experience, and be responsible, open-minded and show a professional level of maturity. An awareness of contemporary educational issues would be an advantage. Effective spoken and written Standard English, having equal opportunities awareness and possessing appropriate ethics and values are also of prime importance.

About the course:

Students on School Direct primary routes at schools partnered with the University of Birmingham will undertake a Postgraduate Certificate in Education with Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) which will provide 60 credits contributing to Master's level.

As part of the programme, students will spend around 26 timetabled days within the academic year at university. The remaining time during the academic year will be at three schools within the Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance.

Following successful completion of the 60 (level 7) credit PGCE (QTS) year, students may then opt to progress onto the Postgraduate Diploma in Teaching Studies and then the MA in Teaching Studies with the University of Birmingham. Students who have completed the 120 credit PGDipEd (QTS) year may progress directly onto the MA in Teaching Studies.

The interview process:

Applicants should apply through UCAS and the application will firstly be considered by the university. If a candidate passes this stage, they will then be invited to interview. This is likely to be held at a school within the Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance.

The interview process is likely to include a formal interview, a mathematics and English test, and may also include a school based task.

The interview panel will then make a recommendation to the University surrounding an offer.

All offers will be made via UCAS.

How school placements work:

Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance spans across two Multi Academy Trusts; there are nine schools within the two MATs and all schools are based across the Wolverhampton/South Staffordshire area.

Placements will be within three of the eight schools, one school per term.

Candidates will teach pupils across the 3-11 age range and students will be based according to their suitability for the school/year group.

Across the year, we will endeavour to ensure students experience schools of varying sizes/profiles and different year groups/Key Stages.

It is the candidate's responsibility to travel to each school and to the University of Birmingham when required.

Qualifications needed

All entrants must have achieved a standard equivalent to a grade 4 in GCSE examinations in English, Mathematics and Science.

All entrants must hold a degree of a UK Higher Educational Institution or an equivalent qualification. This should be of at least a 2:1 classification but we will also consider applicants with a 2:2 degree who have a strong overall profile.

Candidates must have passed the national professional skills tests in both literacy and numeracy by the date stated in any offer.

Other requirements

Before taking up a place, all applicants must complete an enhanced Disability and Barring Service check, agree to abide by the University of Birmingham Code of Professional Conduct and Fitness to Practice and complete relevant checks to ensure they have the health and physical capacity to teach.

Experience in a primary school may be set as a condition following interview.

About the Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance

Elston Hall and St Bartholomew's Teaching School Alliance was formed in 2015.

Elston Hall Primary School is an Ofsted Outstanding three form entry school, and leads the Elston Hall Multi Academy Trust, which also contains Palmers Cross Primary, Edward the Elder Primary and Goldthorn Park Primary.

Working within the Alliance gives students have the opportunity to experience a wide variety of settings across the city, from one form entry schools, to schools with 700+ pupils. Both MATs also have a strong reputation of 'growing their own leaders' with many previous NQTs now in middle and senior management positions.
