Information about

- when the test is
- the format of the test
- how we are getting your children ready

When the test is:

- It will take place within a two-week period in June.
- Schools will decide when best to administer it for your individual child.
- Children in the Year group may be on different days (as there are a lot of children!)
- Children who are absent, can complete the test another day as long as it falls within the testing period.

Why and what are we testing:

- ► All Year 4 children in England will be taking the test this Summer.
- ► The test is compulsory. https://youtu.be/ct5cDctLVTI
- ➤ Your child will work on a tablet, to complete a series of multiplication questions against the clock. They will work independently, and have no sheets or displays to help them. It will take approximately 5 minutes for your child to complete.

What facts are they tested on?

- Children will have 6 seconds to answer each question in a set of 25. Each question will be worth one mark and be presented to the child in this format:
- > ? x ? = ___
- Questions will be selected from the 121 number facts that make up the multiplication tables from 2 to 12. <u>There will</u> <u>be a particular focus on the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times</u> <u>tables as they are considered to be the most</u> <u>challenging.</u>
- Each question will only appear once in any 25-question series.

What happens to the information?

➤ Your child's score will be logged in the computer and we will receive a print out at the end of the test cycle. Each child's individual score will be given, but the questions themselves will not be shown.

► The information will not inform any league tables or be made publically available

What if my child does not do well?

- ► There is no pass mark or fail mark.
- ► The DfE says the purpose of the check is to help teachers identify which children are falling behind and target areas where they're not being given a chance to succeed




Purple mash!
