# Is invasion a successful battle strategy?

### What will we be learning?

- To learn the meaning of the word 'invasion' and understand the possible reasons for and consequences of an invasion.
- To know the location of Italy and the Roman Empire
- To understand why the Roman Army was so successful in their invasions.
- To learn about some of the famous battles that took place during the Roman era.
- To learn about some of the famous battles led by Queen Boudicca.
- To understand the positive impact of the Roman invasions on the inhabitants of those countries invaded.

### What will we be doing?

- We will stage an invasion to develop our understanding of what an 'invasion is and why they occur'.
- We will locate Rome and Italy on the map. We will identify countries invaded by the Roman Empire.
- Use timelines to discuss the time of invasions and why the Roman Army was so successful.
- Present historical facts of famous Roman battles.
- Historical enquiry - carry out a source analysis on Boudicca.
- We will work in group to identify the pros and cons of the Roman Invasions recognising the impact they had on the countries they invaded.
- We will produce a research page about a Roman Emperor including famous battles they were involved in and the outcomes.
