Books are an amazing way to take yourself on an adventure when we have to stay in one place, but they are not the only things we can read.


Can you make a list of all of the other different types of text that you may read in a normal day? Eg) newspaper...



But I'm fleeting like fireworks fading too soon


●● Activity...






