

# Reception Summer Term 2022



This term, our learning focuses upon two new thematic topics: No Place Like Home and Ticket to Ride as well as learning about exciting events through the summer term like the Queen's Jubilee and the Commonwealth Games! Throughout our topics, we begin our learning through a story to develop our Communication and Language skills and to allow us to broaden our writing within Literacy. Our learning takes place through a mix of adult led and child-initiated sessions using the indoor and outdoor environments. We encourage the children to take a lead in the learning with the use of open-ended activities that allow them to develop various 'Characteristics of Effective Learning.

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Across our curriculum, we will continue to develop our skills surrounding Self-Regulation, Managing Self and Making Relationships. We will develop our confidence and resilience to attempt new activities, will take into account others' ideas as well as develop our independence in preparation for Year 1.

## Communication and Language

Through all areas of our curriculum, we will develop our Listening, Attention & Understanding and Speaking skills. We will listen attentively to stories, learn to follow instructions accurately and we will learn to express ourselves clearly and effectively.

## Literacy

In Literacy, our learning will be linked to our thematic topics wherever possible. We will continue to develop and consolidate our Phonic knowledge through reading and writing. Within writing this term, our learning will focus upon simple sentences linked to the stories from our topics. As well as writing captions, simple story writing will support this development as well as introduce narrative writing. We will continue to focus on applying our sound knowledge to build words phonetically and write common exception words.

## Mathematics

As budding mathematicians, we will continue to develop our deep understanding of numbers up to 10 through composition and recalling facts using addition, subtraction and doubling. As well as counting reliably and ordering numbers, we will use our number knowledge to identify numerical patterns and count in groups of 2, 5 and 10. We will also explore telling the time, measuring capacity and recognising coins to count amounts.

## Physical Development

Children receive a taught session of PE each Thursday as well as having daily access to our outdoor classroom, allowing their gross motor skills to be refined. Please remember to provide your child with a full PE kit. We have daily opportunities to develop our fine motor skills through activities in our class Finger Gym as well as cutting and threading.

## Understanding the World

During the 1<sup>st</sup> half term, we will explore the our own homes as well as homes of others from the past to the present day. For the final half term, our topic will then lead us to learn all about transportation, what they are used for and how they work.

## Homework

We will continue to share our learning links through our home learning tasks within our Purple Book. Children will continue to take home reading books following our scheme including both fiction and non-fiction books. Comprehension skills will be developed through the children's independent and class reading.

## Expressive Arts and Design

Over the term, we will develop our skills within this area of the curriculum by exploring and using different media and materials to create different homes using junk modelling and painting. During our learning of transport, we will safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function to create our favourite mode of transport. Throughout both topics, will represent their own ideas by singing songs, making music, dancing, and experimenting with ways of changing them.
