Happy Summer!

Welcome back, we hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable Easter holiday! Our topic for this term is continuing 'Hey Mr. DJ' before moving onto 'Meet the Greeks'.

MFL, R.E and science will be taught discreetly.

Maths

We will be continuing to focus upon number bonds and times tables. Children will practice number bonds to 10, 100 and 1000 as well as continuing with the development of their times tables knowledge. We will continue to use our four-rule calculations knowledge as well as learning new skills linked to fractions and decimals. We will also be telling the time to the nearest minute and solving problems relating to money.

English

This term English will focus on stories with dilemmas, 'Grandad and the Laundry Basket'. This will be followed by persuasive texts and stories from other cultures. The children will be encouraged to use a variety of vocabulary, conjunctions, fronted adverbials and punctuation to enable them to make their writing exciting, ensuring it engages the reader. We will continue to work on spelling, grammar and punctuation skills (SPAG) throughout the year during our daily OMS.

Science

In Science the children will be learning about food chains and sound.

The children will have the opportunity to carry out a range of experiments and record their work in a variety of different ways.

P.E

Children will have a lesson of dance/gymnastics a week as well as a lesson of games.

MFL

In Year 4 the children will continue to learn French. We will be learning to name different types of clothing.

Religious Education

The children will continue to look at why Jesus is inspirational to Christians before moving onto what we can learn about from sacred places.

DT

Our DT learning will focus on food technology where we will be following a recipe and using appropriate tools to prepare ingredients.

Geography

For Geography we will be learning about geographical features and identifying significant places on maps. They will also learn about different weather and climates.

History

In History we will be exploring different sources to investigate the past and evaluate their effectiveness. This will be enhanced by our exciting workshop!



Computing

The children will continue to develop their skills on a range of programmes.

PSHE

During the first half term children will carry on learning about money, as well as discussing how to use money before moving onto healthy lifestyles and safety around medicines and drugs common to everyday life.
